Responsibilities

The College of Science & Engineering at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi (TAMUCC) invites applications for a Forensics Coordinator at the Assistant Professor rank, in the Biomedical Sciences Program within the Department of Life Sciences. This is a full-time nine (9) month position. Responsibilities of the position include teaching courses within the Biomedical Sciences program (especially within the Forensics degree plan), academic advising, participation in student retention activities, and program review activities with accreditation agencies. The typical teaching load for faculty who instruct at the masters' level in Life Sciences is six courses per year. The successful applicant will function as a program coordinator, so there is a one course allowance per semester due to reassignment for the extra administrative duties. Additional releases may be negotiated with the Life Science Department Chair and the Dean of the College of Science and Engineering. The position may include night, weekend, and electronic course delivery. The applicant is expected to organize periodic reviews, develop affiliations and opportunities with local and state law enforcement agencies and court systems, and establish relationships with graduate forensics programs at other universities. The applicant should be able to develop an externally-funded research program which will also support the MS program in Biology and/or any future MS program in Biomedical Sciences.

Qualifications

A doctoral degree in an appropriate field at the time of appointment (September 1, 2018), national certification in an area of Forensics, and professional and/or administrative experience relevant to the position. The successful applicant must be able to obtain and maintain program certification with FEPAC or other professional forensic organizations. Preferred qualifications include current national certification (for example, with the Forensic Science Education Programs Accreditation Commission, FEPAC). This position will function as Forensics Coordinator, and will work with visiting and adjunct faculty involved in content delivery. Applicants are also expected to obtain national certification (e.g., FEPAC) for the Forensics program.

Compensation

This is a full-time nine (9) month position. Compensation is negotiable with the Dean of the College of Science and Engineering at a level commensurate with that of an Assistant Professor holding a terminal doctoral degree in the Department of Life Sciences.
